ESAC'S mission is to maintain facilities for meetings and social gatherings for recovering alcoholics and people of other 12-step recovery programs, their families and friends.

Good News on Meeting Status

2019 ESAC hosted a total of 26 scheduled meetings per week

2020 ESAC was closed for 9 months due to the pandemic—meeting leader volunteers did run AA In-Person meetings, but they were not well attended

2021 ESAC opened it's doors for scheduled meetings and hosted 23 meetings a week—meetings included 15 AA mtgs; 5 Al-Anon mtgs; 2 DAA mtgs; 1 Centering Prayer meeting

As of June 1, 2023 ESAC is hosting a total of 27 meetings a week—including: 16 AA mtgs; 5 Al-Anon mtgs; 4 DAA mtgs; 1 NA mtg; 1 Centering Prayer mtg.

In four years we have come back and now are hosting more meetings than we have in several years! Keep those meetings growing! And thank you to all who have made this possible.

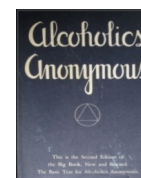
